

David J. Knight honored at Bailey House ceremony

David J. Knight, president and founder of D.J. Knight and Company, a relocation and real estate management firm based in New York, will be honored by Bailey House on June 16 at the nonprofit's 15th Annual Key Awards ceremony.

Bailey House is the second oldest AIDS organization in Manhattan and provides permanent housing and other services for homeless people living with HIV/AIDS.
